Capon's grand piano was moved from the front to the back of the auditorium several years ago when the keys started sticking and the sound board became warped. While the Meeting House will look different without this large piece of furniture, other big pieces of equipment will make their debut soon. Along with a new stage, there are accessories. Both a new curtain and screen have arrived and are being installed. The curtains will retract into the stage walls when in the open position. The screen measures 10 feet by 13 feet, is 200 inches diagonally and will retract into the ceiling. That means it will fill the stage opening from top to bottom with only 18 inches clearance on each side!
